Language Self Access Centre

Day trip to Akaroa

Akaroa is a small, picturesque fishing settlement, about 90 minutes' drive from Christchurch through stunning mountain and coastal scenery. The township was settled by the French in the 1830's and retains much of its early French history.

It is a beautiful place to stroll around, with plentiful shops and other attractions. Students can buy lunch in one of the excellent restaurants or cafes. There is also a very good museum, an art gallery and an historic lighthouse walk. The main attraction is a wildlife cruise by modern catamaran to view dolphins, seals, penguins and other animals. This cruise is included in the cost of the day trip.

Cost: approximately \$120 per student

Trip includes:

- Transport to Akaroa and return
- A harbour cruise and dolphin watching
- Visit to a cheese factory







Lake Tekapo and Mt Cook Tour

Lake Tekapo is nestled in the heart of New Zealand's South Island about 1 hour 40 minutes from Timaru and 3 hours from Christchurch.

The lake lies at the foot of the Southern Alps, which rise to a height of 3000 metres. New Zealand's highest mountain, Mt Cook (Aoraki) is a short drive away and rises to 3,753m (12,313ft).

Visitors from all over New Zealand and the world are amazed by the clarity and sheer numbers of stars visible to the naked eye at night time at Lake Tekapo.

Cost: Approximately \$295 per person

Tour includes:

- Entry to hot pools







Hanmer Hot Springs

Hanmer Springs Village is New Zealand's premier alpine spa destination. Located in North Canterbury about 90 minutes from Christchurch, Hanmer Springs is best known for the award-winning Hanmer Springs thermal pools and spa.

With a bounteous supply of thermally heated spring water, the pools range in temperature from 28-42° Celsius - perfect for soothing away aches and pains or for just unwinding. The Hanmer Springs geothermal water is drawn from a bore adjacent to the reserve complex, providing natural water of the highest quality.

Cost: approximately \$100 per student

Seal viewing is free of charge and guaranteed as the seals feed off rocks which are only a short walk from the beach.
